

SCHOOL DISCIPLINE.

Boys in the First Forms do not normally cause much trouble. Parents will, however, wish to know the system of punishment for bad work or behaviour, which applies to all boys below the Sixth Form.

'SLACKNESS MARKS' These will be awarded for inattention, unpunctuality, failure to obey instructions, unruly behaviour, untidiness of work or person, and in general, for minor breaches of school discipline. Slackness Marks are recorded and an excessive number of Slackness Marks will usually result in some further punishment.

'WORK MARKS' These will be awarded by Masters as an indication of work which is clearly unsatisfactory in relation to the particular boy's capabilities. Work Marks record laziness and inefficiency, NOT lack of ability. Boys whose work or conduct is consistently unsatisfactory may be placed on special "DAILY REPORT".

"WORK" OR "CONDUCT" DETENTION.

Wednesday afternoon detention will be awarded by the Head Master, usually on the recommendation of a member of the Staff, as a punishment for unsatisfactory work or conduct after warning. The names of boys given Detention will be read out in the Tuesday morning Assembly. Detention is a disgrace.

"LATE LINES"

Boys who arrive late without adequate excuse are automatically detained for half an hour. This does not, of course, count as a Work or Conduct Detention, and in any case, the remedy is obvious.

CORPORAL PUNISHMENT.

Flagrant breaches of discipline, and in particular, personal insolence or insubordination to Masters or Prefects may involve corporal punishment.

PREFECTS.

Prefects and Sub-Prefects are appointed by the Head Master from among the senior boys of the Sixth Forms. They exercise authority on behalf of the Head Master and receive his full support in the maintenance of discipline, both outside as well as inside the school. Prefects may recommend boys to the Head Master for punishment, and they themselves may detain boys in Prefects' Detention.

BEHAVIOUR OUTSIDE SCHOOL

The School Motto "DIGNI ESTE FAVORE" requires boys to be mindful at all times of the Heath tradition of over 360 years. Any boy who brings disgrace upon the school by misbehaviour in a public place will be subject to the strictest disciplinary action.

BICYCLES.

Boys may come to school on bicycles ONLY by special permit issued by the Head Master. They should consult their Form Masters about this.
